At Valley Ob-Gyn Clinic we give our patients the option of taking a combination of medications prior to some procedures. We offer this option to patients to minimize the discomfort and anxiety that can accompany some routine gynecological procedures. Your comfort is important to us.

Pre-procedure Medication Instructions

All the following requirements must be met the day of the scheduled procedure or your procedure will need to be rescheduled:

- Pick up your prescription medication from the pharmacy and bring it with you to your appointment.
- Please eat a light meal or snack 1-2 hours prior to your scheduled procedure.
- Tell us beforehand if you take any medications for pain.
- Arrive at Valley Ob-Gyn Clinic **15 minutes before your first scheduled appointment time with your UNOPENED prescription**
- **You must be accompanied by a support person responsible for staying with you during the administration of the medication and driving you home following your procedure.** You will be asked to provide this person's name and cell phone number when you arrive with them.

What to Expect BEFORE the Procedure

- You will be scheduled for 2 appointments
 - The first appointment will be 30-40 minutes prior to your procedure. The UNOPENED compounded medication you brought with you will be administered at this time.
 - You will receive an injection of Toradol (ketorolac) and then you will take the compounded oral medication (midazolam).
 - The second appointment will be your procedure.
 - Note: your provider may also use a numbing spray on your cervix prior to the procedure.

What to Expect AFTER the Procedure

- The drowsiness of the medication will wear off in approximately 3 hours.
- **You should not drive for at least 10 hours following the procedure.** It is strongly encouraged that you have a support person available during this recovery period.
